Regrettably, we cannot attend MedForum 2019 where the transition from Spain to Italy will take place but wish to warmly welcome your team to the IMFN. We have known Toni, Elisabetta and Stefano of Fiorentine Model Forest for some time now and have consistently been impressed with their level of professionalism, dedication and interest in the Model Forest approach. We have every confidence the Tuscany Region will fulfill the secretariat role with the energy, ideas and vigour the region requires to continue to flourish.

Allow me a few words to confirm what the role of a regional network secretariat entails. - Review and approval of new Model Forest members in the Regional Network (in coordination with the IMFN Secretariat)

I look forward to learning about the outcomes of the MedForm meeting and building a long and enriching relationship with the Tuscany Region in Italy – as a strong ally and voice for Mediterranean Model Forests as well as the IMFN as a whole. In that sense, I would like to propose a call in the very near future to get to know each other better and deepen our cooperation. In the meantime, a member of my staff, Ms. Christa Mooney, remains the main contact for Model Forests in the Mediterranean region and stands ready to provide any technical assistance needed as you take on this new role.
