








# ANALYSIS OF THE ONLINE QUESTIONNAIRE ON ECOSYSTEM SERVICES

Analysis and report by Annalisa Spalazzi, researcher and collaborator of the Aterno Valley Forest Model. This activity is part of a broader framework of participatory planning and funding analysis, including calls for proposals, aimed at developing projects that ensure the economic sustainability of ecosystem service in forest governance. The project is supported by the Development and Cohesion Fund 2014-2020, within the Operational Agriculture Plan, Sub-plan 3: 'Multifunctionality of the Forest and Sustainable Use of Renewable Resources in Rural Areas.

## 2) ANAGRAPHICS OF THE MODEL FORESTS


- Formally, all of them are Association (6) or NGO (2).

#### 4) ECOSYSTEM SERVICES RELATED ACTIVITIES AND INTEREST

How much of a priority are the following ecosystem services related' socio-economic activities in the area of interest of the Model Forest?

The most relevant for the whole Mediterranean network are (in brackets, the points for each answer out of a total possible value = 32):

1	Cultural and artistic activities (31/32)
2	Sustainable tourism Forest care (28/32) Fire prevention
3	Research and monitoring Forest bathing (27/32)
4	Wood processing Ecosystem restoration projects (25/32)
5	Biomass energy Water, river, and lake protection in the forest Wild herbs gathering (24/32)




Figure 2: Overall priorities of the Model Forest Mediterranean Network









Figure 3: Priorities for each of the Model Forest Mediterranean Network

The overall results for each of the topics are reported in Figure 2 (page 5). However, specific priorities gather two or more Model Forests around main priorities, as reported in Figure 3 (page 6). Following Figure 3 (pages 7-14), there is the same graph for each Model Forest to highlight the specificities of the local cases and priorities. While it is relevant to highlight the general view and priorities, it is also important to highlight where there are common interests between at least two or three Model Forests to work together in specific activities. 


















# 10. Are you already working on ecosystem services? In what way? What kind of activities? 8 responses




Hence, half of the Model Forest is already working on ecosystem services or at least carrying on actions related to outreach and information.

Each Model Forest shared a good practice to be discussed with other members of the network:

# What are the most significant issues in the area of action of the respondent Model Forest?



The priority areas for the socio-economic development of the interest areas for the Mediterranean network are

(in brackets, the points for each answer out of a total possible value = 56):

1	Creating jobs related to agro-forestry (52/56)
2	Involving local communities in forest care (51/56)
3	Empowerment of women and youth (50/56)
4	Increasing the protection of specific forest areas of high ecological value Countering the abandonment of forest areas by local production Activating tourist and trail routes to boost tourism (39/56)

5	Preventing wildfires
3	(38/56)
